

## **PROTOCOLS CHECKLIST**

Basketball referees depend on protocols for consistent decision-making, ensuring consistency for the teams. This standardization minimizes personal interpretation, especially in 50-50 decisions.

This handbook covers the checklist of the basic protocols every basketball referee should know. Most of them are followed by a video demonstration. By adopting these protocols and using them on the court, you will make better decisions therefore you will have a better-quality officiating.
